# SYW\&GCL LEAGUE <br> RULES 

## FIXTURES

## Schedule of fixtures

All teams' placings within divisions shall be selected based on the previous year's performances, any new team joining the league shall be placed in a division suitable decided upon by the SYW\&GCL committee. A Fixtures list shall be distributed to clubs no later than February. The fixtures shall then be publicised in the handbook and Leagues Play-Cricket website.

## Alterations to fixtures

After publication, a change in the fixtures shall be by the agreement of the two competing teams if:

- Ground is unavailable.
- Any event out of the control of either team. For example, Covid-19 outbreak.

This can be only done once per fixture, once the re-arrangement has been agreed this cannot be moved again.

## Cancellation and rearrangement of matches owing to bad weather.

The home club shall advise the opposition that the game is off and within 1 week offer alternative dates for rearranging the fixture. Do not record any result at all on Play-Cricket until the match has been played.

The league MUST be advised that the match is postponed and that efforts are being made to rearrange the fixture. Email confirmation of the new date should be sent within 1 week of the scheduled start of the match to both the opposition and the SYW\&GCL Team, who will change the date on Play-Cricket. In cases where both teams arrive to play or when weather interrupts the match, captains/umpires shall decide the fitness of the ground.

## Completion of fixtures

All Fixtures within the League, including rearrangements need to be completed by Sunday
1st September 2024, this is to allow sufficient time to plan for the Softball Leagues Finals Days.

## LOANING OF PLAYERS

Teams may lend players to oppositions to ensure a game can take place. The loaned player must come from a team below the division in which they are playing in. Teams within the lowest divisions are exempt from this initial ruling, but all teams cannot loan players from higher divisions. Teams can loan a maximum of 2 players to fulfil a league fixture.

## UMPIRING OF GAMES

Member Clubs are reminded that people undertaking umpiring duties should be suitably knowledgeable of the laws of cricket together with possessing an understanding of the Womens Cricket formats (i.e. pairs cricket, no balls and wides, softball, and hardball rule differences etc.) In the League Committee's opinion people under the age of 16 should NOT be umpiring hard ball games.

## SCORING

## Scorers

The League expects all clubs to ensure that scorers of both teams are provided and are sat together throughout the game when scoring a match.

## Scoreboard

Scoreboards should be used during the game to show an updated log of the scores for both players and spectators.

## PLAY-CRICKET

## Registration of players

All Clubs will register their players to their relevant teams and also the SYW\&GCL via Play-Cricket before their first league fixture. Players may be transferred from first team to second team within a club, with the consent of the SYW\&GCL committee (the Chair, V-C and League secretary), this permission will be granted if there is a genuine cricketing or other valid reason for the request.

## Results

Results are to be recorded on Play-Cricket - The home team will enter the result details onto Play Cricket including full scorecards within $\mathbf{2 4 h r s}$ after the match has been played. The away team need to confirm the result once recorded.

## DISCIPLINARY \& INCIDENT REPORT

If a team have any incidents during the league season and wish them to be brought to the attention of the SYW\&GCL committee, an incident report form MUST be submitted to Brian Hepworth Disciplinary Lead with full evidence provided. A copy of this template report is available within the handbook.

## ECB DIRECTIVES FOR YOUNG PLAYERS

On fast bowling, wearing of helmets in Hardball Cricket and fielding distances are to be observed. An underage fast bowler's overs must not exceed the maximum for her age group, either as to length of spell or as to daily total. In addition, ECB directives on underage players in 'open age' matches are to be observed.

For this purpose, the list of nominated players on the team cards given by each captain to the umpires before the toss must show the age group of any underage player.

Captains are responsible for ensuring the accuracy of this information.

## LEAGUE RANKINGS

## League Standings

Teams will be ranked within their division by their overall points total, If teams are equal on points, then the following criteria shall determine teams league standings:

1. Points
2. Head-to-Head outcome
3. Net Run Rate - this is calculated by the following formula:
net run rate $=\frac{\text { total runs scored in all matches }}{\text { total overs faced in all matches }}-\frac{\text { total runs conceded in all matches }}{\text { total overs bowled in all matches }}$

## Promotion and relegation

Promotion and relegation will be determined by final division rankings.
Primarily with the 2 up-2 down principle.
Note, however, that the YW\&GCL Committee is empowered to vary the details below if circumstances require it. For example, no club can have two teams within the same division, therefore a $2 n d$ team cannot be promoted into the same division as their first team, if this were to happen then the next highest ranked team from the division would be offered the promotion.

## START TIME

Starting times are set at a default time of 10am. They may be adjusted, either by prior agreement between club secretaries (or appropriate official), Early and late in the season, teams rearranging the start time must allow for it getting dark earlier.

## MATCH FEES FOR HARDBALL FIXTURES

In the case of neutral umpires being appointed the league will work towards ensuring at least one neutral umpire is appointed for the Hardball Fixtures, With the appointment of the neutral umpires, Fees will be required to be paid by both teams on the day of the fixture to the neutral umpire(s). These fees are to be split evenly between both teams. The breakdown of fees required can be seen below:

## Super 8's

One neutral umpire assigned with playing teams providing square leg umpire during their batting innings.

## $£ 35$ to umpire

## Division 1

Aiming for two umpires to be assigned within Division 1, teams can choose to play either 30 overs or T20, therefore slightly different payments are issued:

30 overs ( $£ 35$ per umpire or $£ 47.50$ if there is only one standing umpire)
$\mathbf{T} 20$ ( $£ 30$ per umpire or $£ 45$ if there is only one standing umpire)

## SOFTBALL LEAGUE PLAYING CONDITIONS

## SOFTBALL



## No-ball

No extra ball for wides or no-balls for the first 15 overs. Final over: if a wide or no ball is delivered, two runs shall be awarded as well as an extra ball delivery.

- A ball bouncing more than twice.
- Above shoulder height if bouncing.
- Above waste without bouncing.
- Bowler exceeds the crease (front foot)
- There is NO Leg Before Wicket (LBW)

Match ball is a pink-incredi-ball

## PLAYING CONDITIONS

## Pitch

Wickets will be placed 20 yards apart, (bails to be place on the stumps to complete the wickets)
A pitch can consist of either non-turf, grass wicket or outfield of a clubs playing field. The home team must inform their opposition prior to the fixture so that they were appropriate footwear (in case of a non-turf pitch and spikes are not to be worn)

The boundary should be between 40-50 yards around the wicket.

## Teams

There should be 8 players per team, with the batting team dividing into 4 pairs for play to commence.
Players in the Softball league can play from aged 11+ (Year 7) however younger girls (Year 6) are able to play within the league at the discretion of the competing teams.

## The Start

Team cards must be completed prior to the toss at the start of each game. These must be submitted to the standing umpire, with any potential loanee players identified (including which team they are loaned from). As well as this, junior players must be identified with their D.O.B included on the team card. The team card must be signed by the team captain.

A coin toss will take place between opposing team captains to determine which team will bat or field first.

Players can choose whether they wish to use wooden or softball (Plastic bats)
All games will consist of $\mathbf{1 6}$ ( 6 ball) overs lasting roughly 90 mins per game to complete, each team bats one innings, with batting pairs facing 4 overs each.

## The Ball

The ball shall be a pink incredi-ball. Which is an ECB approved ball.

## SCORING

## Batting Side

Each batting team shall start with a score of $\mathbf{2 0 0}$ runs.
Runs can be scored by players running between the wickets, or by hitting the ball across the boundary.
Should the batting pair decide to run, and both make it to the opposite stumps in doing so, one run will be scored, multiple runs can be scored in one delivery.
Boundary scoring is four if the ball contacts the ground prior to crossing the boundary. A six is scored if the ball does not contact the ground, before crossing the boundary.

## Dismissals/Extras

A batter may still run and score if they do not hit the ball or it hits their body, whilst attempting to hit the ball. Byes/Leg Byes shall be signalled by the umpire.
Each time a batter is given out (n.b see methods of dismissals), 5 runs are deducted from the team total and the other batter in the pair will face the next ball (except in the case of run outs where batters will not need to change ends).

Two runs will be awarded to the batting team for each wide (a ball bowled wide of the wicket that the umpire deems it cannot be reached by the batter).

Two runs will be awarded to the batting side for each no ball (where the ball bounces more than twice before reaching the batter or arrives with the batter at shoulder height, or above without bouncing, or if the bowler exceeds the crease before releasing the ball within the delivery).

No extra ball will be allocated for wides or no balls for the first 15 overs of the innings.
In the final over of each innings, if a wide or no ball is bowled, two runs shall be awarded as well as an extra delivery awarded.

## METHODS OF DISMISSAL

A batter can be out in the following ways:

- Bowled (ball hits the stumps and dislodges the bails)
- Caught (without the ball contacting the floor and is within the boundary)
- Run out (the fielders hit the stumps before the running batters can cross the batting crease)
- Stumped (the wicket keeper hits the stumps and dislodges the bails with the ball when the batter • is not behind their batting crease)
- Hit wicket (the batter hits the stumps with the bat or body and dislodges the bails)
- There is NO Leg Before Wicket (LBW) dismissal unless the batter deliberately blocks the ball knowingly in front of the stumps with their leg or foot.
- If a No-Ball is bowled, a batter can only be run out during that delivery.


## BOWLING AND FIELDING

Bowling should be over arm only.

## No more than four overs per bowler per innings.

Players on the fielding side DO NOT need to rotate fielding positions.
With the exception of the wicketkeeper no fielder may field within 10 yards of the wicket, measured from the middle stump except behind the wicket on the off side. A fielder may move into the restricted area to field a ball provided he/she was outside the area when the stroke was made.

A wicketkeeper may wear protective gloves if they wish.
Both teams are to agree before a fixture where bowling is to take place, all at the same end, or to bowl at both ends. If teams cannot agree then as a default, bowling shall be bowled from the same end throughout the match.

## RESULT OF A MATCH

The team with the highest (net) score wins.
A tied game occurs when both teams have the same (net) total.
In the context of the league, points will be scored accordingly, with the team ending the season on the highest number of points winning the league:

5 points for a win
3 points for a tie
1 point for a loss
2 points for a cancelled fixture
2 points for an abandoned fixture

In the event of the scores being tied, the team with the fewest wickets lost shall be the winner.
Win = 5 points / Tie $=3$ points / Loss $=1$ point

Conceding a fixture $=0$ points

## Bonus Points - Bowling

4 wickets taken $=1$ point $/ 8+$ wickets taken $=2$ points

## No-ball

1 run (plus any additional runs from the delivery). And an additional ball shall be bowled within the over.

- A ball bouncing more than twice.
- Above shoulder height if bouncing.
- Above waste without bouncing.
- Bowler exceeds the crease (front foot)

Free Hit after a No ball - The delivery following a front foot no-ball only

The ball shall be women's'
(50z) pink ball

## PLAYING CONDITIONS

## The Pitch

Wickets will be placed 22 yards apart, (bails to be place on the stumps to complete the wickets)
A pitch can consist of either non-turf pitch or grass wicket. The home team must inform their opposition prior to the fixture so that they were appropriate footwear (in case of a non-turf pitch and spikes are not to be worn)
The boundary should be between 55-70 yards from the centre of the pitch.

## The Start

Team cards must completed prior to the toss at the start of each game. These must be submitted to the standing umpire, with any potential loanee players identified (including which team they are loaned from). As well as this, junior players must be identified with their D.O.B included on the team card. The team card must be signed by the team captain.

A coin toss will take place between opposing team captains to determine which team will bat or field first.

## Fielding restrictions

In all Formats at the instant of delivery, there must be no more than 5 fielders on the leg side.
Fielding restriction areas are to be marked on the field with inner ring markers at intervals of 5 yards.
The inner ring shall consist of two semicircles at 25 yards from the centre of the pitch joining the ends of the semicircles, and parallel to the line joining the two middle stumps.
In an uninterrupted innings, at the instant of delivery for the first 6 overs (T20) \& 9 overs ( 30 overs) no more than two fielders are permitted outside the outer fielding restriction area

For the remaining overs, no more than five fielders are permitted outside the outer fielding restriction area.

If any fielder fails to meet any of the requirements of these fielding restrictions, either umpire shall call and signal No Ball as soon as possible after the instant of delivery.

## Fielding restrictions in curtailed matches

If the overs for an innings are reduced, the number of overs for which the restrictions are to apply will be reduced as follows.

| Total overs for innings | $10-19$. | $20-23$ | $24-26$ | $27-29$ | $30-32$ | $33-35$ | $36-38$ | $39-41$ |
| :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: |
| Overs for restrictions to apply | 5 | 6 | 7 | 8 | 9 | 10 | 11 | 12 |

## DURATION OF MATCHES \& TEAM FORMAT

Games can be either a 20 or 30 over game and be played with 8-a-side for T20 or 30-over games with 11 players per side, this must be agreed no less than 72 hours before the fixture by both teams and the umpire.

All T20 competition fixtures shall be played as a 8-aside game.
30 over games are 11-aside fixtures.
Each side shall have one innings, consisting of at most the number of overs as set out in the schedule below. Time limits are of playing time, which does not include drinks, etc.

|  | 11 a side | 8 a side |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| Number of overs | 30 | 20 |
| Max overs per bowler | 6 | 4 |
| Limit for 1st innings | $21 / 4 \mathrm{hr}$ | $11 / 2 \mathrm{hr}$ |

NOTE that a drinks interval is not playing time and is extra to the time allowed for the innings.
The number of overs set out in the schedule above is in each case a maximum. If adverse conditions of ground, weather or light, or exceptional circumstances interfere with the progress of play, the umpires have the power to reduce the number of overs from this maximum.

If playing time is lost for other reasons, the overs shall not be reduced unless the umpires consider that the circumstances are sufficiently exceptional to warrant this.
In making such a reduction, the umpires should have regard to the prospects of play in view of the prevailing conditions, as well as to time lost.

## THE BALL

All matches must be played with a 'women's' (50z) pink ball. The fielding side are responsible for providing the ball for their fielding innings. Spare balls, also women's pink balls (but not new) must be on hand should the match ball get lost.

## WIDES \& NO BALLS

1 Extra run will be awarded to the batting team for each wide (a ball bowled wide of the wicket that the umpire deems it cannot be reached by the batter).

1 Extra run will be awarded to the batting side for each no ball (where the ball bounces more than twice before reaching the batter or arrives with the batter at shoulder height, or above without bouncing, or if the bowler exceeds the crease before releasing the ball within the delivery).
Wides and no-balls will count as 1 run (plus any additional runs from the delivery). And an additional ball shall be bowled within the over.

Free Hit after a No ball - The delivery following a front foot no-ball only shall be a free hit for whichever batter is facing it. If the free hit delivery is not legitimate (no ball or a wide), then the next delivery shall become a free hit for whichever batter is facing it. For any free hit, the striker can be stumped or run out. If the no-ball results in a wicket no free hit will be awarded. If a no-ball is bowled at the end of the over, the first ball of the next over will be a free-hit.

## BOWLING RESTRICTIONS

For Matches that are scheduled for 30 overs, bowlers shall bowl no more than 5 overs per innings.
For Matches that are scheduled for T20, bowlers shall bowl no more than 4 overs per innings.

## METHODS OF DISMISSAL

## A batter can be out in the following ways:

- Bowled (ball hits the stumps and dislodges the bails)
- Caught (without the ball making contact with the floor and is within the boundary)
- Run out (the fielders hit the stumps before the running batters can cross the batting crease)
- Stumped (the wicket keeper hits the stumps and dislodges the bails with the ball when the batter is not behind their batting crease)
- Hit wicket (the batter hits the stumps with the bat or body and dislodges the bails)
- Leg Before Wicket (LBW - The batter is out LBW if all the circumstances set out apply)
- the bowler delivers a ball, not being a No ball.
- the ball, if it is not intercepted full-pitch, pitches in line between wicket and wicket or on the off side of the batters' wicket
- the ball not having previously touched her bat, the batter intercepts the ball, either full-pitch or after pitching, with any part of her person
- the point of impact, even if above the level of the bails, either is between wicket and wicket or if the striker has made no genuine attempt to play the ball with the bat, is between wicket and wicket or outside the line of the off stump.
- but for the interception, the ball would have hit the wicket.

If a No-Ball is bowled, a batter can only be run out during that delivery.

## TEA INTERVAL

There is to be a 30-minute break for tea, taken between innings for a limited overs game unless this is impractical.

If for any reason it is impractical to take tea between innings, the umpires shall be responsible, with the agreement of both captains, for retiming the start of the interval.

If tea is not between innings, then the 10 minutes interval between innings will be taken.
In exceptional circumstances, a longer tea interval may be agreed. In any case the agreement must be made, between captains and umpires, before the toss.

If adverse conditions or exceptional circumstances cause loss of playing time, the umpires, together with the captains, may alter both the starting time and the duration of the tea interval, providing that no tea interval is less than 20 minutes.

Clubs are not required to provide the 'teas' during the break and teams can bring their own provisions, as well as informing the umpires so they are aware.

## DRINKS INTERVAL

One drinks interval per innings is permitted in an innings.
The captains must agree before the toss whether they wish to have drinks. If agreed, the interval shall be after half the number of overs have been bowled.

If, however, the umpires consider that very hot weather conditions warrant it, and both captains agree to it before the toss, a second drinks interval will be allowed. The two intervals should be after one-third and two-thirds of the overs, adjusted to the nearest whole number.

If a wicket falls during the over immediately prior to a drink's interval, drinks will be taken immediately.

## RESULT

## For a valid result:

In Division 1, 30 overs or a T20 game, each side must bat for 10 overs or more, unless one side is all out in fewer than 10 overs, or Side B passes Side A's score in fewer than 10 overs.

A match in which the prescribed minimum is not achieved, or in which there is no play at all, will be designated an abandoned match.

The team with the highest score wins.
In the event of the scores being tied, the team with the fewest wickets lost shall be the winner.
If both the scores and wickets are the same, then this shall be recorded as a tied game.
In the context of the league, points will be scored accordingly, with the team ending the season on the highest number of points winning the league:

## 5 points for a win

3 points for a tie
1 point for a loss
2 points for a cancelled fixture
2 points for an abandoned fixture
0 points for conceding a fixture.
Bonus Points - Bowling

- 1 point for 4 wickets taken
- 2 points for $8+$ wickets taken


## Bonus Points - Batting

- 1 point for $100+$ runs scored
- 2 points for $150+$ runs scored

There should be 8 players per team, with the batting team dividing into 4 pairs for play to commence.
Players in the Softball league can play from aged 11+ (Year 7) however younger girls (Year 6) are able to play within the league at the discretion of the competing teams.

## The Start

Team cards must completed prior to the toss at the start of each game. These must be submitted to the standing umpire, with any potential loanee players identified (including which team they are loaned from). As well as this, junior players must be identified with their D.O.B included on the team card. The team card must be signed by the team captain.

A coin toss will take place between opposing team captains to determine which team will bat or field first.

## The Duration

All games will consist of $\mathbf{1 6}$ (6 ball) overs lasting roughly 90 mins per game to complete, each team bats one innings, with batting pairs facing 4 overs each.

Fielding side to alternate bowling ends during innings.

## The Ball

All Super 8's matches must be played with a 'women's' (5oz) pink ball. The fielding side are responsible for providing the ball for their fielding innings. Spare balls, also women's pink balls (but not new) must be on hand should the match ball get lost.

## SCORING

## Batting Side

Each batting team shall start with a score of $\mathbf{2 0 0}$ runs.
Runs can be scored by players running between the wickets, or by hitting the ball across the boundary.
Should the batting pair decide to run, and both make it to the opposite stumps in doing so, one run will be scored, multiple runs can be scored in one delivery.

Boundary scoring is four if the ball contacts the ground prior to crossing the boundary. A six is scored if the ball does not contact the ground, before crossing the boundary.

## Helmets and/or Faceguards

Any player under the age of 18 playing in the Hardball Super 8's League must wear a helmet in line with ECB safety guidance.

## Dismissals/Extras

A batter may still run and score if they do not hit the ball or it hits their body, whilst attempting to hit the ball. Byes/Leg Byes shall be signalled by the umpire.

Two runs will be awarded to the batting team for each wide (a ball bowled wide of the wicket that the umpire deems it cannot be reached by the batter).

- the ball, if it is not intercepted full-pitch, pitches in line between wicket and wicket or on the off side of the batters' wicket
- the ball not having previously touched her bat, the batter intercepts the ball, either full-pitch or after pitching, with any part of her person
- the point of impact, even if above the level of the bails, either is between wicket and wicket or if the striker has made no genuine attempt to play the ball with the bat, is between wicket and wicket or outside the line of the off stump.
- but for the interception, the ball would have hit the wicket.

If a No-Ball is bowled, a batter can only be run out during that delivery.
can only be run out during that delivery.

## BOWLING AND FIELDING

No more than four overs per bowler per innings.
With the exception of the wicketkeeper no fielder may field within 10 yards of the wicket, measured from the middle stump except behind the wicket on the off-side. A fielder may move into the restricted area to field a ball provided he/she was outside the area when the stroke was made.

## Free Hit after a No ball

The delivery following a front foot no-ball only shall be a free hit for whichever batter is facing it. If the free hit delivery is not legitimate (no ball or a wide), then the next delivery shall become a free hit for whichever batter is facing it. For any free hit, the striker can be stumped or run out. If the no-ball results in a wicket no free hit will be awarded. If a no-ball is bowled at the end of the over, the first ball of the next over will be a free-hit.

There must be no more than 5 fielders on the leg side or a no ball will be called.

## RESULT OF A MATCH

The team with the highest (net) score wins.
A tied game occurs when both teams have the same (net) total.
The Home team shall record the result of a match through Play-Cricket no later than 24 hours after the match is completed, The Away team shall then confirm the result once it has been recorded.

In the context of the league, points will be scored accordingly, with the team ending the season on the highest number of points winning the league:
5 points for a win
3 points for a tie
1 point for a loss
2 points for a cancelled fixture
2 points for an abandoned fixture
0 points for conceding a fixture.
